

AREA 63 FALL ASSEMBLY MINUTES: OCTOBER 2006

Meeting opened by Area Chair, Perry G. How it works, 12 Traditions and 12 Concepts were read by Chris S., Mike and Evelyn respectively.

DELEGATES REPORT: Estelle G, Panel 56. (Attached below)

AREA COMMITTEE BREAKOUT SESSIONS WERE HELD

AREA 63 (SD) DISTRICT REPORTS

DIST 2: Anne F, DCM; located in western SD, including Rapid City, east to Wall. There are 28 registered groups, with 11 active in district meetings. They had 11 votes for this meeting. Many dist 2 members were active in preparations for this conference. Special thanks to Chris, his committee, Todd from the Area 63 committee and others for the successful CPC luncheon. Thanks to John and hosting our district quarterly meeting/picnic with about 60 people. The hotline has 6-7 active groups involved. Correction/Treatment has added volunteers and meeting. We are continuing to encourage additional groups to become active in the district. There will be a celebration of sobriety held at noon, on Nov 11th at the Minnelli Senior Center, Rapid City to celebrate Fritz J's 55th sobriety birthday.

DIST 3: Lloyd S, DCM; located in west-central SD. There are 5 registered groups, with 2 active at district level. The Out of Towner's having a 12 step weekend Nov 3-5 Blue Cloud Abby.

DIST 4: Bob G, DCM; located in southeastern SD, including Yankton, Vermillion, Freeman, Tabor, Tyndall and Springfield. There are 8 registered groups, all active at district level. A Native American from there district submitted his story to the Grapevine. Vermillion has combined three groups into one called Vermillion Unity AA and meet at the Trinity Lutheran church.

DIST 5: Joan G, DCM; located in East Central SD, including Sioux Falls, Chester, Madison, Brandon, Salem and Flandreau. They had 5 votes for this meeting. Dist 5 co-hosted a potluck supper with Dist 11 in Sept. The Area 63 delegate gave her report. Positive feedback was received and they hope to do it again. An Alca-thon is tentatively scheduled for Feb 12. More help and participation from groups is always welcome at the district level.

DIST 6: Jess C, DCM; located in NE SD, including Aberdeen, Redfield, Webster, Milbank, Big Stone, Britton. There are 10-12 registered groups, with 6-10 active in district. They had 5 votes for this meeting. Turn out for the last district meeting was much better than expected. District 6 is back! They are trying to locate the district check book. It's reported to exist, but has yet to be found. A New Years Eve dance is planned at the Redfield clubhouse. Dist 6 is planning to submit a bid for the 2008 spring conference.

DIST 7: Rod B, DCM; located in n central SD, including Mobridge, Herries, Selfby, Hoven, Gettysburg, Pierre, Ft Thompson, Murdo, Draper and Vivian. Dist 7 is active again. Officers were elected, including Rod B, DCM; Loyd B, sec; and Ken H, Treasurer. Participation of the away groups in northern part is difficult. There is a lot of hard work ahead, because the district has been inactive since the unfortunate death of Marcy L, in 2003. The SDWP is located in Dist 7. They are discussing hosting a district event to celebrate AA 75th in June 2007. WELCOME BACK DISTRICT 7!

DIST 8: Ruth R, reporting for Sally S; located in East Central SD. They have 6 registered and active groups in district. They have 4 dist meetings per year, rotating locations. The dist continues to have round robin monthly meetings. Activities are posted on Area 63 website.

DIST 9: Leslie D, DCM: Located in Brookings, Clear Lake & Watertown with 8 registered groups, 3 active at the district level. Groups are doing well with no complaints heard. They have one new group in the district.

DIST 11: Susan J, DCM; located in southeast region, including Beresford, Centerville, Parker, Irene, Alcester, Elk Point and surrounding towns. They have 7 registered groups, 5 active at district level. They had 4 votes present. The Area 63 delegate spoke at their service potluck, which had the theme: We Are Responsible. Delegate gave talk on giving back to the program through service and being self-supporting. Positive comments were received from those that participated and the district appreciates the delegate's time & experience shared.

DISTRICT REPORTS CONTINUED:

DIST 13: Karla M, DCM; located in Northern Hills, including Belle Fourche, Deadwood, Lead, Spearfish & Sturgis. They have 7 registered groups with 5 active in the district. They had 6 votes at this meeting. Dist 13 is experiencing expanded groups and meetings, with at least 7 meetings per week. A traditions workshop was held in Sturgis. NHRG will host their annual men's retreat Jan 6th at Storm Mountain. District participation could always be better.

DIST 1, 10, 14 & 15 are not active at the Area 63 level.

AREA 63 (SD) BREAK OUT SESSION COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC INFORMATION: Terry M chaired with 8 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed guidelines for posting flyers on the Area 63 website.
2. Discussed how we are helping school districts in our area.
3. Discussed need for a banner with web-address.
4. Discussed need to develop guidelines for Area 63 webmaster.

CPC (Cooperation with Professional Community): Todd T chaired with 5 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed the GSO service structure as it pertains to CPC work at the Area, District, Group and individual level and how to carry the AA message.
2. Reviewed action items from the August assembly.
3. Received feedback from members on creating a booth for health fairs.
4. Reviewed progress on creating a "How To" information packet for GSRs & DCMs.

LITERATURE: Lori P chaired with 5 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed how to save money on shipping costs by taking advantage of bulk purchases.
2. Reviewed distribution of literature in Area 63.
3. Considered how each district should handle literature orders to defray shipping costs.
4. Recommend that excessive pamphlets are available at literature table.
5. Suggested that every member order the Grapevine magazine.

REMOTE COMMUNITIES / SPECIAL NEEDS COMMITTEE: Jim K chaired with 6 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed materials from GSO for ASL and audio cassettes.
2. Committee has Big Book & 12x12 on both ASL and audio.
3. Committee has video on subject: "Message behind These Walls."
4. Considered survey results for special needs and remote members. 12 groups responded and the data is incomplete. Hope to have raised awareness amongst groups.

ARCHIVES: Leslie D chaired with 4 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed the archives workbook.
2. Noted that the archives are temporarily located in Beresford clubhouse because the facility in Mitchell was not temperature controlled.
3. Discussed the need to research a "permanent" storage location.
4. Discussed the on-going process of going through the archives.
5. Discussed developing a traveling display for Area functions.
6. Discussed acid free covers (no information available at this meeting).

AREA 63 (SD) BREAK OUT SESSION COMMITTEE REPORTS CONTINUED

REPORT & CHARTER: Chris D chaired with 4 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed the minutes from the 2006 Summer Assembly.
2. Suggested that committee mailings that are not directed to the entire Area should handle the mailings by committee, rather than including in the Area minutes.
3. Discussed correction of Area 63 Minutes – Confidential Listing of officers and DCMs and listing all 15 districts, which reflect the Area 63 district map. Also, the term “inactive” will be replaced with the term “not listed”.
4. Discussed process of merging districts.
5. Discussed “How to Guide” and need to revise and update.
6. Recommend Ad Hoc committee be formed, comprised of 2 members from the Charter committee, Policy & Admission and Finance to revise the booklet and present to the Area at the Winter Assembly in March 2007, to be presented for approval by the Area at the Summer Workshop.
7. Need to define the committee’s duties and responsibility.

WEB SITE COMMITTEE: John E chaired in conjunction with PI committee.

1. Webmaster duties the past two months have consisted of day-to-day upkeep for the Area 63 Website. These duties include the following:
 - A. Answer email requests for meeting information, with approx 40 requests in the last two months;
 - B. Requests for updating meeting information, which is an ongoing process; PLEASE, when requesting a change be made, include all pertinent information about your group, including the group name, address, GSR, contact info, etc. I have actually rec’d requests for changes without a group name.
 - C. Posting events that are occurring within the Area. These requests are best submitted in a word processing document file (.DOC) format. The webmaster can then edit the document, if needed, and convert to .PDF format for posting. Editing is occasionally required to remove “last-names” from the document. Event flyers are best suited for submitting to the webmaster.
2. Webmaster has submitted expenses of \$29.80 for our website. The Area does not have a credit card to pay for the monthly expense of the website, so the webmaster takes care of this personally and submits the expense for reimbursement.

CORRECTIONS: Dean B

1. Discussed scheduling a breakout session with speakers that could share during that breakout session on Friday at the 2007 Spring Conference.
2. Recommend adding a “corrections breakout” sessions to the Spring & Fall conferences. Will forward to Policy/Admissions committee.
3. Area 63 needs more volunteers for bridging the Gap program in rural areas.

POLICY AGENDA: Norm with 7 members.

1. Reviewed policy handbook, conference guidelines in workshop guidelines and resolutions from past 5 yrs.

FINANCE: John T chaired with 6 members in attendance.

1. Reviewed treasurer’s report.
2. Reviewed letter dated 9/01/06 written by the Area 63 treasurer.
3. Audited checkbook.
4. Reviewed the proposed 2007 budget.
5. Considered showing to Area 76 the PowerPoint on self-support presentation at the spring 2007 conference.
6. Considered drafting a proposed budget at Spring Conference and finalizing the proposed budget at the summer workshop.
7. Recommend the formation of an Ad Hoc committee to reviewed, revise and submit for group approval the “How to Guide” on hosting conference and workshops to the Charters & Admissions committee.

OLD BUSINESS (2) ITEMS FROM THE 2006 SUMMER ASSEMBLY

1. A motion was reopened to increase the stipend for Area officers and chairpersons by \$25 per event during the year, allowing a total of \$100 for workshops and \$125 for Conferences, increasing the annual operating budget by \$1200 for the year. Motion was approve 39-10, with one abstaining.

Minority opinion: Voiced concern that current budget does not allow for being self supporting and that we're voting in favor of increased budget on what might come in form of group contributions. One person in the majority changed their vote, but the majority of the assembly did not vote to reopen the item.

2. A motion was reopened and seconded to approve the proposed budget, including the proposed budget with increased stipends.

Discussion was heard to be concerned about approving a budget that does not reflect the amount of income the Area is showing. It was voiced that costs to provide services has increased and that the Area groups should support the service structure. It was asked what would occur if the budget was not approved. Area Treasurer would use the past budget with stipend increase. Groups were aware of the increased budget and the majority of groups present voted to approve the stipend and the budget. Contributions were up after letter requesting more participation from the Area groups. Call of question & seconded. Majority agreed. Motion was approved 37-6.

Minority opinion: voiced concern that we're already short and hoping that money will come in; No one in the majority was overturned.

NEW BUSINESS: None.

What's happening in our Area

- It was an honor and a privilege to attend the Delegates report and potluck hosted by Districts 5 & 11. There was a good turn out and we discussed Area and General Service items. A special thanks to DCMs Joan and Susan for making me feel welcome (and of course, the wonderful food ☺)

- We have (2) new registered groups in our Area:

- Camel Club meeting Monday 5:30 (closed) and Friday 7:00pm (open) at First Lutheran Church Main Ave and 8th St in Brookings. They are a part of District 9. Please help them to feel welcome and encourage them to share with the Area.

-Box Lunch Group meeting Thursdays at 12:00 noon at 200 E Main N. Street Rapid City. They are a part of District 2. Again, please help them to feel welcome to the Area.

•I have a couple of copies of La Vina (the Spanish version of the Grapevine). (Although I have some experience with La clase de espanol, not enough to understand...) if anyone can use them, please let me know.

What's happening in our Region

We are part of the West Central Region. This includes Minnesota, Iowa, North Dakota, Nebraska, Wyoming, Montana and of course Area 63 South Dakota.

What's happening at GSO

•I encourage everyone to read Quarterly report from GSO and the Box 459. This time in the Box 459 there is an interesting article about Sister Ignatia who was a huge part of our early history.

•I have a final copy of the Pacific Regional Forum if you are interested in reading it. There are some interesting questions from members to GSO staff.

•The PI committee has sent some information regarding which stations across the country that will receive a copy of the new television PSA. The following television stations in South Dakota will receive a copy:

-Rapid City: KCLO-TV, KEVN-TV, KIVV-TV, KOTA-TV

-Sioux Falls: KDLV-TV, KELO-TV, KDLV-TV, KPLO-TV

•There is still time to submit an article for the Native American pamphlet. There are guidelines that need to be followed and I have a few extra copies of those. It really would be nice to have someone from our Area submit an article to help the Native American identify.

•The Grapevine recently conducted a survey of readers. Some interesting highlights: 85% of responders said the Grapevine was "an essential must read" or "very valuable". 86% of responders are very satisfied with the Grapevine. And 65% of readers gave a Grapevine subscription to others.

•Some very interesting news: The AA directories will not be published this year. They are currently working on a less costly alternative for 2007. In the meantime, the 2005-2006 directories will be available. If you are interested in more information regarding this topic, I have the letter from our General Service Manager and the AA World Services Board.

•During the week of September 25, our records keeper (aka our distinguished Area 63 Secretary Chris D) received packets regarding "Active/Unknown" status groups. IT IS VITAL THAT WE COMPLETE THE INFORMATION BY NOVEMBER 10, 2006.

-Note: A group becomes listed in the GSO database as Active/Unknown when it does not have a General Service Representative (GSR) or alternate GSR or mail contact with a viable address on file.

•There is a question that is being asked of all Areas: having a Class B (alcoholic) trustee serve as Chairperson for the General Service Board. This may seem like a complicated issue, so I'll try to summarize. The main question is whether or not electing a Class B (alcoholic) as Chair results in any changes in the composition of (7) Class A (non-alcoholic) trustees to 14 Class B (alcoholic) trustees ratio?

-I don't think I really made that less complicated, so if you would like to see the background information, I'd be more than happy to discuss it with you ☺. I would like to get a group conscience of how our Area feels on this issue.

•I would like to take some time and review the Final Conference Report. So often we hand them out and they sit at our groups without realizing what kind of useful information is included in the report.

I can't believe its been a year since the elections! Boy how time flies. My next venture will be Board Weekend in New York, January 25-29th. Please be sure to attend our next area assembly MARCH 24-25th (Pierre chamber) where we will be discussing the General Service Conference agenda items.

Dear Friends of Bill and Bob,

I am pleased to report that our Area 63 financial picture is improving. Thanks to many very generous contributions from groups and individuals throughout Area 63, our General Fund Checking account ended 2006 in the black. **Our 2006 beginning balance was \$8,608.53 and the ending balance was \$8,813.62, giving the Area 63 General Fund a net surplus of \$205.09 for 2006.**

I have equally positive news to report to you concerning the Area 63 Conference Fund. You may recall that the 2006 Spring Conference incurred a net loss of \$1,587.26, which was taken from the Area 63 Conference Fund. Though I have not yet received the checks, according to the financial statement I received from the Conference Treasurer, the 2006 Fall Conference made a net profit of \$1,659.30. **This will allow us to repay the Conference Account the \$1,587.26 loss from the Spring Conference, leaving \$72.04 to distribute to Area 63 AA and Al-Anon, based on Conference attendance. Congratulation and many thanks to the 2006 Fall Conference Committee for a job well done!**

Having given you the good news first, now is not the time for us to sit back and relax, knowing that Area 63 is back to financial health. Please recall that we adopted our 2007 budget at the Fall Conference which included an increase of \$1,860 from 2006, for a total of \$13,500. **That translates into \$1,125 of monthly contributions necessary for Area 63 to meet its ongoing financial obligations.** Contributions for January 2007 to date total \$665, leaving us with \$460 left to receive for the month to stay current. Having seen to level of commitment to Area 63 shown by many faithful contributions the past seven months, I am confident that as an Area we can meet to 2007 budgeted expenses. Together we can continue to make Area 63 a stronger service arm of AA to carry the message to alcoholics statewide.

Thank you for your continued faithful support of your Area 63 Service structure.
